1. Minutes of previous meeting (Unapproved Minutes –September 15, 2011)

Engeswick/Nickerson: Moved to approve: Passed

3. Formal Proposal for Advising Task Force (Kellian Clink) (3:05 time certain) (Emailed to Executive 10/03/11)

The Task Force has been meeting for 2 years. The advising website looks like it is showing forward motion, but we need to continue to monitor its development. A survey of students and advisors was conducted asking to name good/bad advising practices and asking for suggestions to improve advising. From this survey, a large document was produced. The problem areas appear not to be the SRCs, but the advisors themselves. Many advisors self-selected as a big part of the problem. The Task Force suggests that each college may now need an Advising Working Group to study the training needs of the people who are doing the advising. Unless advisors are happy with their stills and resources, advisee's won't be happy. Task Force suggests that the proposed Advising Working Group include at least one member from each college. One expected task of the Working Group would be guidance of the website development. Members of the Working Group would become a point person who could quickly answer advising question, and be someone to advocate for advising on our campus. (Question): There are problems with distance learning and transfer students; we expect them to figure things out for themselves. We need to address this.

(Question): Isn't this an administrative issue? (Grabowska): David Jones would be in charge. Carson: distance learners are paying fees, what are they getting if not advising? (Engeswick): What faculty and students think is important in advising may not be the same.

Engeswick/Nickerson: Moved to propose at least one FA member from each college take part in an Advising Working Group: Passed.

(Question): Can we have you write a charge for the group? Kellian: Yes.

4. FA Writing Task Force - Final Recommendations regarding the Writing-Intensive Requirements (Heather Camp) (3:18 p.m. time certain) (Emailed Update to Executive 10/07/11)

This Task Force was created to investigate the writing intensive requirements at MSU. We are finalizing our report. The Task Force recommends that 2 writing intensive course requirement need to switch from a general education requirement into a graduation requirement. With this change, non-general education focused writing courses can count for the requirement instead of just general education writing courses.

(Question): We are investigating this because our current situation violates MnSCU requirements. How does it violate? (Nickerson): Because MnSCU says it does.

MnSCU will force us to separate the writing requirement from the general education requirement. This switch to graduation requirement does not preclude general education courses; it just opens the door for others to count as well.

(Question): So students coming in with an AA that meet General Education requirements would still have to complete some more courses to meet this new graduation requirement? (Camp): Yes.

(Question): How can we approve writing intensive courses without the control through general education? (Nickerson): Vetting the courses will take several years. The mechanics/process of offering upper division writing intensive will need to be developed.

- b. Budget (Ellen Mrja) Budget has been working very hard on proposals for one time money. If there are any issues, there is room on the SM&C agenda
- c. Extended Learning (Danae Ouirk Dorr) The Extended Learning Sub-Meet met on Sept. 28th. The Sub-meet supports moving the new Proposal for Distribution of the Online Tuition Differential dollars forward. The need for planning and reporting on the use of differential tuition was discussed and will be a topic of continued discussion.  - * This year the Faculty research committee (FRC) will only have \$50,000 in grant moneys to distribute. Thi is close to a 50 % decrease from last year. The committee will fund all approved proposals until the funds are depleted this first round. If any funds remain or new funds are designated for Faculty Research Grants(FRG) later this academic year they will be distributed in the spring funding cycle. An email was sent to all faculty informing them regarding this.
 - * The FRC discussed the conflict of interest guidelines for the FRG grants. If a member of the FRC is submitting a grant application for funding they will withdraw themselves from the entire selection process and find a replacement from their department. If a member is an adviser on an application, but has no financial gain resulting from the Grant they will abstain from voting.
 - * During the October and November meetings the FRC will be reviewing and selecting which proposals will receive FRG funding
